Glen Waverley Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of our school's voluntary financial contributions for 2023.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We thank our families for their continued support. It has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer, for instance we provide:

- A variety of advanced learning (Innovations) programs such as Maths, English, Sport, Music, Art, Mandarin, STEAM and Multimedia
- A variety of intervention programs such as Targeted Student Learning (TSL) and
- Our very own Speech Pathologist.

Throughout this year our families support has allowed us to undertake school improvement projects such as:

- Purchasing additional ICT equipment such as iPads, notebooks, printers and robotics resources
- Redevelopment of the student bathrooms near the library
- Replaced the asphalt and updated the line marking outside the Early Learning Centre
- Replace the carpet in some of the portable classrooms
- Installed solar panels on the gymnasium roof and
- Installed additional water tanks throughout our school.

Some of the school improvement projects planned for 2023 include:

- Continue to replace and add to our school's technological footprint – additional iPads, notebooks and robotics resources
- Replace the asphalt at the front of the school
- Install a large cover over the basketball court
- Install additional storage units in some classrooms
- Complete the second phase of the development of the student bathrooms near the library
- Refurbish the bathrooms in the Early Learning Centre and
- Continue developing our school's garden beds.

The preferred method of payment at our school is through Compass. We are accepting payments via Compass for 2023 Parent Payments from 31 October 2022. Student stationery kits will be available for collection from the school office from 28 November 2022.

Refunds

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
